PURPOSE OF THE POSITION

Reporting to their Team Lead, the Lifeguard/Camp Counselor will be creating the most excellent pool program. This includes games and activities for all our campers to enjoy - while still ensuring the safety of all campers and staff in the swimming area.

When not in the arts and crafts room you would work collaboratively within a team to provide care and support for individuals with disabilities. You will play a key role in fostering an inclusive environment where all campers feel valued and accepted during their time at camp. The position requires the Camp Counselor to ensure each camper receives personal care, behavior management, and supervision in a safe, respectful, and nurturing manner. The Camp Counselor will be on-site 24/5 while campers are present, providing continuous support and guidance throughout their camp experience.

- Have the "welcome to our pool" introduction for all the staff during orientation explaining rules and protocols
- Notify the Camp Coordinator of any problems with the pool, mechanical, fouled, or other
- Support campers during morning and evening bedtime routines, and mealtimes
- Assist campers with transfers using one/two-person or mechanical lifts
- Support campers when they might feel distressed and encourage a positive outlook
- Provide personal care for campers as needed, including but not limited to; feeding, bathing, toileting, and dressing
- Recognize and support each camper's specific needs, providing the best possible physical and emotional care while assisting in behavior management when applicable
- Maintain a clean and organized cabin while encouraging campers to take an active role in daily cabin clean-up
- Provide feedback and share information to help maintain a smooth experience, and offer suggestions on what can be improved
- Participate and encourage camper participation at dance, skit, and campfire nights
- And anything else your creative side might bring out
