WE MOVED... ONLINE

2020, what a year! Registration for the summer season commenced in early February and the exciting buzz of Camp He Ho Ha joy began. Then within only weeks that excitement turned to disappointment and sadness. Due to provincial restrictions and the vulnerable health and safety of our campers worsened by the Covid-19 pandemic, we announced the heartbreaking cancellation of our summer camp programs on March 29th, 2020. The emails and phone calls that came to Camp in the following days and weeks brought many tears to our staff's eyes.

Some of the caregivers we spoke with were not sure how they were going to break the news to the campers in their lives. The anticipation of Camp He Ho Ha programs builds with every month between when a camper last attended to when they get to attend again. For many of our campers, they would only begin to understand 'not going to camp' when the realities of being locked down at home due to Covid-19 restrictions affected their day-to-day lives. How could something that they have been enjoying for many years suddenly be unavailable to them? They had many questions, 'Why can't we go to Camp?' 'Why can't I see my friends?'

It was our staff's heartbreak and the stories of heartbreak in our campers that made it obvious that we needed to continue to offer an opportunity for our campers to see each other and have some fun. Due to the diligent efforts of our summer camp coordinator, Kelly French, Virtual Camp He Ho Ha was born. In July and August, Camp He Ho Ha offered 21 online summer camp programs.

Programs included everything from Arts & Crafts to Skit Night performances, Counsellor punishments, and a relaxed Chill & Chat. The success of these camps and the requests of many campers for more programs meant that we continued the programs through the end of the year, with no plans of stopping before in-person camps resume.

In a year of learning to adapt, we are grateful for the ability to remain connected and make a difference in the lives of people with disabilities.

A LOOK BACK



As we reflect on 2020, we are reminded again of the extremely important role that Camp Health, Hope & Happiness plays in the lives of individuals with disabilities in Alberta. A service made possible by the unwavering support of our very supportive community partners and donors.

The past year was certainly a year like we have never experienced before, or ever imagined possible. With the news and uncertainty of the pandemic early in the year, the most difficult decision of cancelling the 2020 summer camping season was made. Quickly the summer camp team pivoted and shortly after we were hosting our first-ever virtual summer camp for Albertans with special needs. Since then, we have worked hard staying connected with our campers who love and miss Camp Health, Hope & Happiness so very much by offering multiple virtual camps each month.

The pandemic not only affected our summer programs, but it affected our ability to generate revenues. Our facility rental program typically generates over \$450,000 annually; funds that are used to cover much of our operational costs. The situation forced us to shut down our rental program and our facility remained empty from the end of March through the rest of 2020.

It was a challenging year to host any type of fundraising activities aside from virtual events. Unfortunately, the restrictions on social gatherings forced our main fundraising events (yoga retreat, archery shoot, and golf tournament) to all be cancelled. I am grateful to those supporters who generated funds online through our virtual platforms.

With operations shut down, and revenues minimized it was necessary to temporarily downsize our team to reduce expenses. I am so grateful for the dedicated camp team that was so understanding of the difficult decisions that were made throughout 2020.

Summer programs for Albertans with disabilities only exist because of the generous donors, community partners, volunteers, Camp He Ho Ha staff, and board members.

Thank you for believing in the work we do at Camp Health, Hope & Happiness to support the amazing community of Albertans we serve!

WE ROSE TO THE CHALLENGE

2020 is certainly a year none of us will ever forget. For the first time in Camp's 60 years of operation, there were no campers on site. However, Camp He Ho Ha remained true to its mission of providing recreational opportunities to children and adults with physical and mental disabilities. Even though the campers could not camp physically, through virtual camps staff did an amazing job bringing the spirit and joy of camp to the campers while keeping everyone safe. These virtual camps enabled Camp He Ho Ha to remain in touch with campers, and have provided moments of joy and connection during what has been, for many, an isolating year.

Unfortunately, Camp's ability to fundraise was hindered by the pandemic. All in-person fundraising events were cancelled and, much like the rest of our lives, went online. Camp launched the Gratitude60 campaign and found success. However, fundraising continues to be a challenge in this new virtual world. We all look forward to the days when we can hold in-person events and can connect with our donors and community again.



Even though Camp's fundraising and operations were dramatically scaled back, thanks to the diligence and guidance of Executive Director Greg Nielsen, his staff, and the board, Camp ended the year with an operating surplus of \$73 thousand and a net deficit of \$34 thousand, due to \$151 thousand in capital and equipment purchases. The Camp holds healthy cash reserves and is well-positioned to continue operation when safe to do so.

Camp He Ho Ha continues to march on with the support and commitment of many talented people. Our Executive Director is unshakable with his dedication to Camp. He made many tough decisions that will ensure that Camp is there to welcome campers again when it is safe, and we would not be where we are without him. To all the staff at Camp, as well as the many who keep Camp in their heart: you are the backbone of the organization. I am in awe of the work you do and the creative ways you maintained the spirit of Camp He Ho Ha through this year. My additional thanks go to my fellow board members, who provide a diverse range of experience that helps guide the organization.

Finally, our sincerest gratitude goes to the donors, who see the magic that Camp brings. Thank you for continuing to support us with your generosity, encouragement, enthusiasm, and friendly faces.

While 2020 had its challenges, I hope that we have all been able to find the good the year also brought.

As the world was quiet, many of us were able to take the time to discover new hobbies, spend more time with our families, and come together to connect and create a community in this new world. To our campers, we cannot wait to see you again; Camp misses you and we will be here to welcome you with open arms again when it is safe!

FACILITY RENTAL PROGRAM HALTED YET HOPEFUL

Rentals began with an encouraging start to what should have ended in another successful season. Funds generated in the first three months of 2020 totalled just under \$100,000 showing potential to be on par with previous years.

Following the closures and other public health safety measures taken across Alberta to curb the spread of the Covid-19 virus, 2020 became a very challenging year for Camp Health, Hope & Happiness, and the world in general.

In the later part of 2020, inquiry phone calls and emails began coming in almost daily leaving us with hope & a sense that the later part of 2021 will see positive changes and the return of our much-valued guests. A number of these inquiries even resulted in future tentative bookings. These advanced bookings encourage us and allow our guests to dream of the day when they can once more spend time with friends & associates in a social setting at Camp He Ho Ha.

GONE BUT NOT FORGOTTEN

In 2020 Camp Health, Hope & Happiness lost a long-time friend and a cherished board president in Ivor MacBeath. Ivor had been a volunteer for 54 years with the Associated Canadian Travellers organization -one of Camp's founding organizations. Long before his journey with Camp began officially he spent years serving the ACT with many of the proceeds raised donated to Camp. As he became aware of Camp He Ho Ha's mission, and the very significant role his club played in our success, Ivor became instantly and enthusiastically involved.


His journey with Camp He Ho Ha formally started in 1992 when he and his partner Betty volunteered at Camp's first-ever Snowmobile Rally. Throughout the event you could find him directing traffic, parking vehicles, setting up tables, cleaning up after the dinner and dance, and whatever else was required.

Ivor also served as Camp's Casino Chairman for numerous years, managing it from start to finish and securing sufficient individuals. A daunting task, but he always managed to have an entire complement of volunteers for every Casino. It was difficult to say "No" to Ivor. A commitment was a commitment to him, and he always delivered.

Ivor never missed an Open House, or an opportunity to appreciate our Camp donors, friends and family. Since 1994, Ivor has served on the Board of Directors in various capacities except for a handful of years. Ivor was serving as the President of the Camp Board at the time of his passing.

MAJOR MILESTONES

A look back at major capital and infrastructure projects in our 60-year history:

- 1960** Camp started with donated accommodations and dining trailers and a medical centre.
- 1963 - 1968** Construction of on-site sleeping accommodations, outdoor swimming pool, recreation hall and dining hall.
- 1983 - 1988** Construction of indoor pool complex, and accommodations (hostels and hotel rooms) and meeting room buildings.
- 1996** Addition of new Camp activity attractions: 18-hole mini-golf course and three-sided 40' climbing wall, high ropes course and wheelchair-accessible low ropes course.
- 2002** Re-roofing completed on dining hall, recreation hall, pool, and accommodations buildings.
- 2008** New maintenance shop constructed at the entrance of Camp.
- 2012** New on-site sewage treatment plant constructed.
- 2013 - 2014** Undertook large infrastructure upgrading project to re-floor cabins and pool, replace: water filtration system/ water heaters/ concrete sidewalks/ asphalt sidewalks/ black dirt pad/ archery shed, rebuild the garage, add automatic doors, and add new signage.
- 2017** Upgraded accessible toilet stalls throughout the facility.
- 2019** Upgraded waterfront/chapel/Bates Point/Westhaven sidewalks and pathways.






