What We Achieved

Our Programs

The summer of 2023 was looking positive for our campers and our aching hearts that had been missing the He Ho Ha experience for so long.

We began our summer staff recruitment efforts in December by posting our available summer jobs at over 25 post-secondary institutions across Canada. The response to the employment offers was slower than we had hoped but with great effort we secured a small summer staff team that would enable us to host a reduced capacity (60% of regular) version of our programs but overnight programs would still be a GO!

Alongside this, we opened registration in early February. Camper enrolments came in strong with 790 enrolment requests for the spots that we could offer. The first arrival of campers was scheduled, and we could feel the energy building with our campers as they anticipated the return to overnight camps at He Ho Ha.

To our surprise, 3 days before our summer staff team was scheduled to arrive at Camp He Ho Ha to commence training, the catering company that had committed to providing our meal services for our staff, campers, and aides for the summer of 2024 announced that they were cancelling our contract and would not provide their services for us. We had so many people scheduled to attend our programs but no way to feed them.

We scrambled, posting jobs for cooks and kitchen assistants, calling everyone that we knew, emailed our campers to harvest any food providers or cooks that could come from that circle of influence as well, but alas we were forced to lay-off all of the summer staff (even before their arrival) and cancel the summer camp programs as we knew them.

But we rivalled in the only way we knew how. We kept 4 of our summer staff team and converted our programs into a continuation of the day camp and virtual camp programs that we had trialed in 2022. This time, we were able to offer 1 day camp for each of the 10 camps that we would normally host. These were a raging success! We kicked off the season with a Canada Day celebration on July 1st with our senior campers, then continued to the SPACE, the Wild West, a carnival, the Olympics, the jungle and more! The greatest benefit that came from our day camp programs was the shared attendance between the camper and a caregiver. The caregivers were able to witness the joy in the campers as they got to show-off their summer retreat to their loved one.

Annual Fundraising Events

- 1. Shoot 4 Cause Our signature Archery event drew an enthusiastic crowd, uniting community members for a weekend of spirited competition and camaraderie. Thanks to your participation and generosity, we raised a remarkable total of \$77,580.40. These funds are crucial in supporting our ongoing programs and initiatives.
- 2. Run, Ride & Roll This dynamic event, which invites participants to run, bike, or roll, captured the community's spirit and dedication. Although smaller in scale, the passion and commitment shone through, helping us raise \$6,643.30. Every dollar contributes significantly to our cause, helping us reach our objectives.
- 3. Swing Fore Camp The golf enthusiasts among our supporters gathered for the much-anticipated Swing Fore Camp Charity Golf Tournament. This event not only provided a day of exceptional golfing but also raised an impressive \$82,862.36, our highest of the year. This tremendous support directly enhances the quality and reach of our programs.

Grants

In addition to event-based fundraising, we were fortunate to receive \$9,213.00 in grants from various philanthropic organizations. These funds are instrumental in filling gaps where event funding does not fully meet the needs, allowing us to maintain and expand our services.

Overall Impact

Combining our energetic fundraising events with the strategic use of grants, we raised a total of \$176,299.06 this year. Each event not only raises funds but also awareness and community spirit around our cause. We extend our heartfelt thanks to all participants, donors, volunteers, and sponsors. CAMP HE HO HA RENTAL PROGRAM

With summer just around the corner, and our summer camps for individuals with special needs about to begin, we pause to consider the success of the 2023 Camp Health, Hope & Happiness rental program.

There is no denying the past few years have been difficult for everyone including Camp He Ho Ha and the facility rental program. Covid and increased expenses have certainly taken a toll but we are happy to report groups are returning, enabling them to enjoy their hobbies and fun social activities. Thankfully, it includes a stay at He Ho Ha.

Camp was pleased to host 1,666 rental guests which in turn added just shy of \$436,000 of rental revenue to the bank account.

Customer service is a top priority our goal is to ensure all guests are well cared for and feel that Camp is their home away from home. Concerns are rare, taken seriously and addressed as quickly as possible.

Compliments are graciously accepted and relayed to the appropriate staff.

Many of the groups accessing the facility are long-time supporters; some attending for 30 plus years. Genuinely good friends of Camp.

Regardless of the length of the stay, or the number of people attending, the Camp He Ho Ha team works hard to ensure each guest feels special and that the doors to Camp Health, Hope & Happiness are always wide open to friends, both old and new.

Our Financials

Treasurer Report

The most significant change in fiscal 2023 was that we were able to welcome campers back for overnight weekend camps. It was wonderful to continue serving our community and see more campers than we have been able to in prior years.

Camp ends 2023 in a strong cash position of \$4.35 million, with a minimal amount of payables of \$133 thousand. However, it is important to note that the aging infrastructure at camp requires upgrading, and subsequent to year-end, the board has restricted more cash for large upcoming capital projects.

During 2023, seven weekend camps were offered to campers free of charge, resulting in no camper revenue for the current year. Camp was able to offer camps free of charge due to strong fiscal stewardship in prior years; we are forever grateful to have weathered the storm and come out strong.

Total revenue decreased by just shy of \$750 thousand in 2023. The decrease is due to a very strong fundraising year in fiscal 2022; however, revenue is consistent with normal fundraising years.

During the year, we had an increase in expenses of just under \$300 thousand. This is mainly due to funds needed to operate the weekend camps (including salaries and wages) and unavoidable repairs and maintenance. Due to the increase in expenses, the camp ended the year with an operating deficit of \$230 thousand.

Overall, we are thrilled to have been able to welcome campers back for overnight camps and fulfill our mission of providing safe and rewarding recreational opportunities to children and adults with physical and mental disabilities. We are grateful to be in a strong cash position that continues to allow us to make camp accessible to so many people.








Ammortization of Deferred Capital \$144,000 10.2%

These campers truly are the fuel that keeps the entire staff team motivated through challenging times. We continue to strive to find ways to make a difference in their lives.

From our board members who have guided the organization through its successes and challenges...to our enthusiastic volunteers for generously giving of their time...to our unwavering staff for their unparalleled effort and dedication and to our happy campers for their inspiration!

We look forward to embracing the challenges that lie ahead to ensure the legacy of Camp Health, Hope & Happiness on Lake Isle continues to change lives for individuals with disabilities in Alberta.
